What is worse is that their children are no better. One of them came here recently with his girlfriend. He was surprised at first and then quite annoyed that my husband and I did not accept that they sleep in the same bedroom. "That's what everybody does," he said, "and a trial marriage is recommended before getting married." My husband tried to reason with them, make them understand that God's laws exist and that it is by following them that one prepares one's happiness. Not only do they not practise their religion, but they no longer believe in God or the devil. Poor young people!

We are not perfect; we have our imperfections and our faults. However, our life as a couple, well prepared, was happy in spite of the tribulations we had to face. As we look back on the past, we are certain we did our best to raise our children in a Christian manner. What decadence today! All we have left is prayer and the hope they will understand some day that true happiness is not found where they are seeking it. Our pain and suffering is that of many parents who, like us, are worried over the fate of their children. We can even say that the same is true everywhere; we only have to look around us.

This is the first time I lay bare my sorrow in this way. When I saw what was announced in the last issue of "L'Étoile", this prompted me to write to the Spiritual Letter Box, so as to share my sorrow and help others who are facing the same problems because I suppose that your answer will be encouraging and beneficial.

However, these young people also need to be protected by a Marian devotion which they have acquired and will keep up, and be fortunate enough to live in a milieu which forewarns them of all these errors and protects them.

Remain confident, there will be a return to better days like the sunshine after the storm. While awaiting that joy, be loving and gracious with your family, without giving in, however, to demands which go against your principles. There is no need to add to your sorrow the responsibility of not having helped these young people, trying to dissuade them from allowing all kinds of factitious pleasures to enter their lives. Even if they do not accept your words right away, they will remember them and, when they are faced with troubles and disillusionment, they will not be able to accuse you of not having forewarned them of what was lying in wait for them. Continue to keep up your joy of living and be confident in a merciful God who will grant them forgiveness, thanks to your supplications and your prayers.
